- a. Mandy talked through work that the equity committee has done in the past few months including ADA audit and bathroom accessibility updates. Hired a paver company to re-level and clean the pavers.
- b. Board updates:
  - i. 2026 budget and levy approved.
  - Board discussing the watershed-wide flood study with staff and Barr Engineering
- c. Hopkins central park project got the ok. It creates more water storage in the park and more site runoff removal of phosphorus and sediment
- d. Rosland park filtration vault continues to be worked on to maximize efficiency
- e. 1 GreenCorps member starting next week for 11 months
- f. Gearing up for the 10 yr water management plan

### 6. District updates

- a. Thank you for all your help with the survey! We have 192—238 survey responses, and 39 44 map comments! These will be compiled and presented to the board in November. Will also be available on our website.
- b. State of the Waters! Save the date: Thursday, January 29, 2026 from 6-8 PM
- c. All grant funding is given out, but will open back up in January. Idea was put forward for a tour of grants for CAC members.

### 7. Upcoming volunteer events

- a. Trash clean up at Oxboro lake (93<sup>rd</sup> and Syndicate Ave, Bloomington) October 12 10am-12pm. Historically hasn't had much involvement from NMCWD, but the lake gathers a lot of trash. Recent community meeting showed that residents appreciate a more active involvement from NMCWD. The trash cleanup has a community partner, Deeper Water Arts, who will have their people volunteering, and also hopefully getting lunch delivered.
- b. May need CAC input on website changes, later in the year, or early next year.

#### 8. Other

- **a.** Question on if permitted raingardens get inspected. Staff/interns do inspect them, which gets put into our tracking system. But once the permit is closed, less inspection to see if the garden remained.
- b. Salt Watch program sunsetting, Gael will send out more later in October.
  - i. Previously collected data had not shown clear trends or specific areas to target. Staff have decided to pivot to more targeted salt reduction education to large campuses and businesses.

- iii. Also, Izaak Walton League still sends strips for free to test lakes/creeks.
