




Aerial view of Nine Mile Creek where the birds were photographed. (Map adapted from Google maps.)









These are photographs of 104 bird species that I have seen walking along a 2/3 mile section of Nine Mile Creek by Edina High School and Creek Valley Elementary School in Edina, Minnesota. These birds were photographed between May 2012 and October 2014.

Every time I go on a walk, there is something new to see. From these walks, I was fortunate to have a glimpse into the lives of these birds. Bird parents work very hard to keep their young fed and safe. Their chicks are always in danger from predation, and small birds band together to chase away potential predators. Weather is also a concern. Many chicks died after heavy rainstorms. In my mind I can still hear the distressed sounds of the catbirds and song sparrows calling for their chicks after rain flooded their nests and their chicks were gone.

There are also joyful times when the ospreys soar in the air riding the thermals, seeming to enjoy flight itself. In the Creek Valley Prairie, the songbirds are loud and noisy in the fall as they feast on Cup Plant and Compass Plant seeds.

I would like to thank my mentor for this project, Erica Sniegowski, of the Nine Mile Creek Watershed District for her enthusiastic encouragement and guidance and Dr. Linnea Hall, Executive Director of the Western Foundation of Vertebrate Zoology, for verifying my bird identifications.
