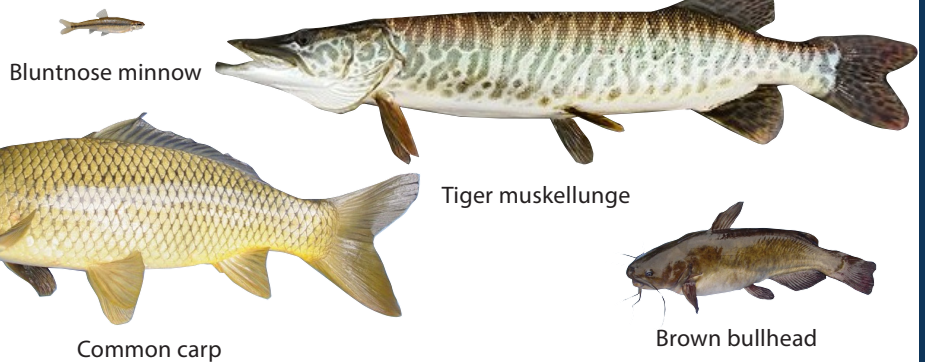

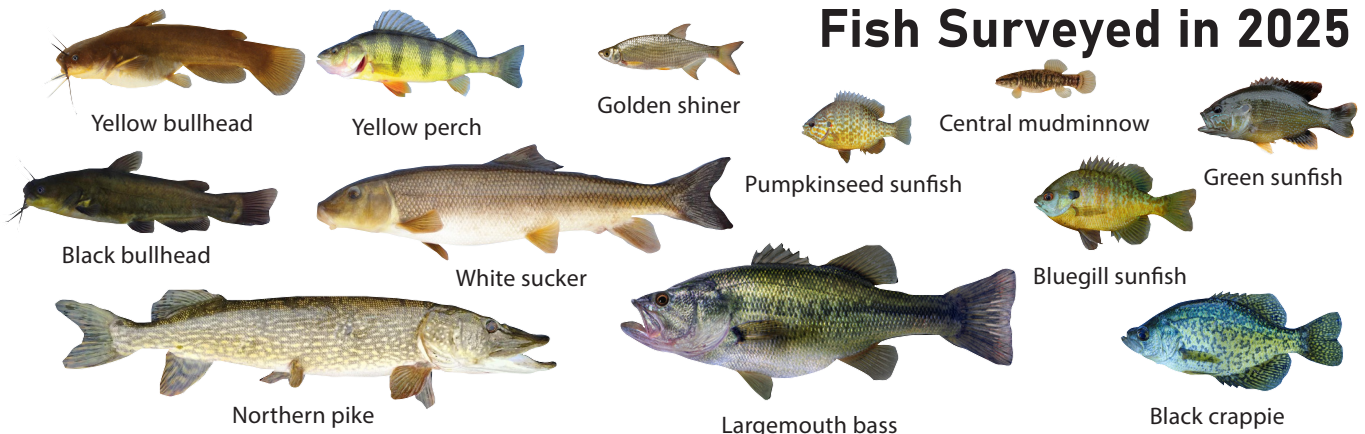

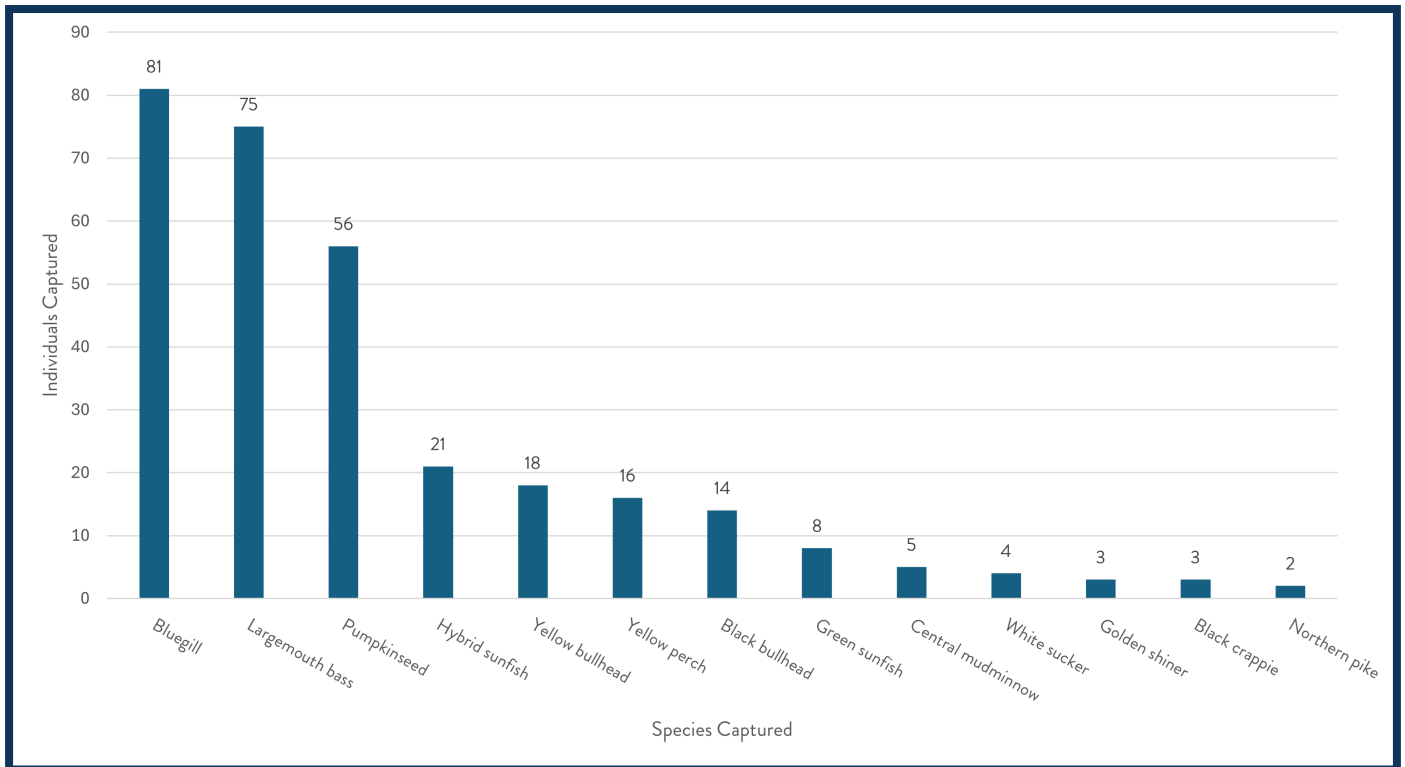
All Fish Species Ever Documented
