RE: Education & Outreach Coordinator's Report for August 2020 Board Meeting

Program Updates

Adult Education

The Writing Nature Nearby webinar had about 20 people tune in. Amber Stoner, the presenter made journals that we mailed out to the first 20 people to RSVP. We also ended out mailing out another 5 afterwards to those that requested them.

We will be hosting a pilot raingarden maintenance program at the beginning of September. The purpose of this is to eventually provide a maintenance class for Cost Share Grantees, as well as for our partners at the City of Bloomington, who requested a class like this for their curbcut raingarden program participants. We will be hosting it at Oak Grove Presbyterian Church, so that we can also begin to include and teach the non-profit project partners as they prepare to take over maintenance of their raingardens in a few years. As the program develops, we will host more and open them up to more people, while staying within the recommendations for social distancing.

K12 Education

The Normandale Hills Elementary raingarden project will likely be moved to spring, as planning for fall hybrid learning is taking up most of the teachers' time.

Megan and I, with the input of 2 CAC members, have filmed a few more educational videos for teachers to use in the fall in their classrooms (virtual or otherwise). These will be posted on the District's YouTube channel.

Outreach

Megan, Erica, and I continue to work on lake fact sheets. The District's engineer has begun to review them for accuracy and presentation.

Miscellaneous

Program and Outreach Tracking

Megan and I are working on tracking our reach, despite the limitations of COVID on programming. This includes tracking the number of clicks and opens on our various website blog posts, newsletter articles, and social media posts. We will be sharing this information

with our cities as well, so they can use that in their MS4 tracking. We are organizing this tracking both by topic (including groundwater, AIS, Adopt a Drain, water quality and others) as well as by general audience type (including adult, K-12, and family).

This tracking information will be presented to the Board near the end of the year.
