Maintenance Declarations

4.3.5, 3.4.7, 6.5

Importance:

Maintenance declarations help ensure infrastructure for stormwater infiltration (most common), wetland buffers (less common) and waterbody crossings (least common) are maintained. When a maintenance declaration is required for a watershed permit, follow these steps:

Drafting:

- A. Download the maintenance declaration template for <u>private entities</u> from <u>https://www.ninemilecreek.org/permits/</u>
- B. Follow directions and fill in blanks to the best of your ability
- C. Send to NMCWD for a check of the draft. NMCWD staff will correct any issues and send back to you. Do not move on to signing and notary steps until a draft is approved by NMCWD staff.

Signing and Notary:

There will either be 1 or 2 pages that need to be signed and notarized. These are often the 2nd to last, and possibly 3rd to last pages.

Record with Hennepin County:

- Recording on the property's deed can be done either by mail or e-recording:
 - Mail: Follow directions, mailing address, and payment requirements here:
 https://www.hennepin.us/residents/property/real-estate-recording-information
 - E-record: contact a local title company for recording

Prove Recording:

- Send NMCWD one of the following:
 - Receipt from Hennepin County
 - Email from Hennepin County staff confirming document is recorded
 - Link to list of documents recorded on the property that shows maintenance declaration
 - Screen shot (from title company with e-recording) showing the maintenance declaration is received or pending with Hennepin County. Example below:



For single family home projects, the proof of recording is not required until permit closeout
