

#### Wetland Buffer Markers

The Nine Mile Creek Watershed District's rules list requirements for marking wetland buffers. This fact sheet is a guide to meeting those requirements (rules section 3.4.5).

#### ALL wetland buffer markers must:

- Be permanent (e.g. resistant to weather conditions)
- Have text approved by District




## In addition, for buffers on private land, markers must:

- Be free standing
- Be placed at upland edge
- At least one on each lot line
- Have no more than 200 feet between signs on one lot



# In addition, **for buffers on public or right-of-way land**, choose an option:

- OPTION 1: Monument(s) flush to ground
- OPTION 2: Breakaway marker(s) of durable material
- OPTION 3: Follow private requirements (left)



### **Wetland Buffer**

The native plants in this area provide habitat, prevent erosion, and protect water quality.

No removal of native plants or mowing in the buffer area is allowed without permission under watershed
